Lesson 11 – God Is Merciful

INTRODUCTION

Read Article How did the cross fulfill both of God's attributes of justice and mercy? 1 Pet 2:24

EXPLORATION

Note: "No, O people, the LORD has already told you what is good, and this is what he requires: to do what is right, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." **Micah 6:8** (NLT) **Read 2 Samuel 12:1-15 & 24-25**

Note: David committed adultery with Bathsheba and had her husband murdered in chapter 11.

- 1. How does the parable relate to the events of the previous chapter?
- 2. Why does the absence of justice and mercy in Nathan's account so enrage David? Vv. 5-6
- 3. What is Nathan's perspective on gratitude? Vv. 7-9
- 4. What was the principle way David violated God's mercy? Vs 9
- 5. What was David's response to God's mercy?
- 6. What were the consequences of David's actions on him? On his family? On others?
- 7. Why didn't God spare David of the consequences his sin?
- 8. What other redemptive purpose is accomplished by God's severe mercy? Vv. 24-25
- 9. How does our willingness to extend mercy affect our relationship (intimacy) with God?

Read Matthew 18:21-35

- 10. Offenders in Jesus' day were forgiven up to three times; a fourth offense need not be forgiven. What does Jesus' answer say about forgiveness? Vs 22
- 11. Why did the king cancel the servant's huge debt?
- 12. What was the reaction of the forgiven servant to someone else's small debt?
- 13. Why were the other servants deeply grieved?
- 14. How did the lord of the servant respond to his servant's lack of mercy? Vv 31-34
- 15. What should be our motivation for forgiving others?
- 16. Based on this parable, do you think God's forgiveness is conditional? Limitless?
- 17. What does this passage say about venturing to risk forgiveness (again)?

APPLICATION

- What steps are you going to take today with a person in your life who needs God's mercy?
- Are you harboring resentment against someone or having difficulty forgiving him or her? If so, how could you make corrective action?
