LEADER DEVELOPMENT: CONTENTMENT

INTRODUCTION

What has been your level of contentment when working for a Christian boss? A non-believer? **OBERSERVATION/INTERPRETATION**

Read 1 Timothy 6:1-10

1. How might the principles of verses 1-2 apply to life in the Pentagon and the NCR? Note: Some theologians suggest that a modern social structure is a worker/boss relationship that replaces the slave/owner. Paul was worried that disrespect for the Gospel would lead to disrespect for the author. Eph 6:5-9; Col 3:22-4:1. Paul seems more concerned with responsibilities than rights.

2. How does Paul describe false teachers?

Note: Sound doctrine in verse 3 doesn't just refer to reading scripture, but refers to "abiding" in Jesus Christ, the ultimate source of doctrine that makes one spiritually healthy and vigorous.

- 3. What motivated these teachers to pursue false doctrine? Vv. 4-5
- 4. How could someone think that godliness was a means to financial gain?
- 5. What brings us great gain? How would you describe it? v. 6

Note: The word "contentment" (autarkeia) "was a great word in Stoicism, expressing the essence of the Stoic ideal, which was to be independent of external circumstances."¹⁵³ Paul Christianized the term, using it to refer to an attitude of mind independent of externals and dependent only on God. He was not advocating godless self-sufficiency as a source of contentment. Paul believed that true sufficiency is Christ-sufficiency¹

- 6. With what should we be content? Define contentment and describe what it looks like for you? What is the result of discontentment? Matt 6:25-34
- 7. What is the significance of verse 7, "For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it"? Job 1:21
- 8. According to Paul, what is wrong with money? Vv. 9-10; Matt 6:24
- 9. How can money be changed into heavenly treasure? Matt 6:19-24
- 10. What is the difference between obsession and contentment with regard to money/material things?

11. What is the relationship between money, contentment, and serving God?

• About what situation in life will you ask God to help you be more content each day this week?
