INTRODUCTION:

• If you found out that someone you trusted deceived you, what would you do?

OBSERVATION/INTERPRETATION:

Note: This is not a new problem. Joshua chapter seven describes a time when Achan coveted plunder and thought he could keep it a secret. After a defeat, God said that he would not stay with the Israelites unless they removed the sin from their camp. When they discovered what Achan did, they stoned him and his family and burned them with fire.

Read Acts 4:32 – 5:11

- What did Ananias and Sapphira sell? (1, 2)
- What did they have to gain by lying about the proceeds?
- How did their transaction compare to that of Barnabas? (36, 37)
- What was Ananias' sin? (3-4)
- To whom did Ananias lie? (4) see also Psalm 51:4
- What did Peter ask Sapphira? Why? (1, 8)
- What would you have been thinking if you were carrying out Ananias?
- Do you think God was too severe? Why doesn't this happen today?
- How would the we be different if we had a similar fear of God?
- How do you deal with dishonesty in your work place? In your home?
- In what ways are you tempted to be dishonest in your professional life? Personal life?
- In what ways will your complete honesty make you a blessing and a curse in your workplace?

APPLICATION:

- Is God pleased with your honesty as a husband, father and professional?
- In what ways is the Holy Spirit convicting you of your honesty before God?
