- 6. How did God help Daniel? v. 19
- 7. How did Nebuchadnezzar know that God gave Daniel the answer? v. 28
- 8. What was Nebuchadnezzar's view of God after Daniel's interpretation? v. 46
- 9. What do these verses say about the extent of God's sovereignty?

Read Daniel 4:29-31; Proverbs 19:21; Jeremiah 10:23, 24.

- 10. What was wrong with Nebuchadnezzar's view of God's sovereignty?
- 11. How might a person develop such a view of God (and himself)?
- 12. How can you make sure that your perspective is more like that of Daniel?
- 13. If God is sovereign, why do we pray? John 8:28,29
- 14. If God is in control, why are there so many tsunamis, earthquakes, murders, etc.? Rom 8:28,29

APPLICATION

- What plans about the future do you need to turn over to God's sovereign control?
- What do you fear that God might ask of you if you completely surrender to Him? What must you do to gain God's perspective?
