#### INTRODUCTION

Why do you think that so many people are trying to find "extra-biblical" information like "The Davinci Code?"

## OBSERVATION/INTERPRETATION Read II Timothy 3:10 – 2 Tim 4:5

Note: Like Paul, Judaism virtually universally accepted the Old Testament as God's word. Listing examples of "every good work" (2 Tim. 3:17), Paul employs standard terms from ancient education (2 Tim. 3:16); "training" especially characterized Greek education (the LXX often used the term for discipline). Reproof was especially important in Judaism, where it had to be done privately and gently first. The proper authority, source and content for any of these works was Scripture.

- 6. What does it mean that scripture is God-breathed (theopneustos, "inspired")? Vs. 16
- 7. For what is scripture useful? Vs 16
- 8. What will people one day do with truth? 2 Tim 2:20-21
- 9. How might the truth of scripture affect a person that digested it on a regular basis? **Jn 5:39**;

#### Read John 1:14; 14: 6; 8:31,32; Num 23:19

- 10. What is Jesus' relationship to the truth of scripture?
- 11. How does the truth set someone free?

#### **APPLICATION**

- How can you build the truth of scripture into your own life this week?
