Lesson # 3 What Isaiah Promised

INTRODUCTION

Why does it seem like the unrighteous often prosper and get ahead? **OBSERVATION/INTERPRETATION**

Read Isaiah 3:1-15

- 1. What are the supply and support that Judah has counted on that will be taken away? Why?
- 2. Why are people hesitant to become leaders? What social chaos will follow? Vv 4-7
- 3. What does it mean to parade sin? Vs 9 What does that look like today?
- 4. God has established a broad relationship between obedience and blessings, disobedience and curses. **Dt 5:32-33** Why were many of the righteous afflicted with the wicked? Vv 10-11
- 5. How did the rich plunder the poor? How does that happen today?

Read Isaiah 3:16-4:1

Note: Nose rings of gold and other precious metals were worn by brides. It was disgraceful for women to be childless.

- 6. Why weren't there enough men to go around? Vs. 25
- 7. How does Isaiah portray the judgment on the proud women of Jerusalem?

Read Isaiah 4:2-6

Note: Some interpreters view the phrase "branch [tsemach] of the LORD will be beautiful and glorious" as a sign of the land's fertility. They view it as a parallel to the next phrase, "the fruit of the land will be the pride and glory of Israel's survivors." Others take the "branch of the LORD" as a messianic title based on other occurrences of the word, used in the sense of the springing forth of salvation (2 Sm 23:5) or "a horn" (Ps 132:17) for David. These passages, because they speak of the continuing line of David, carry a messianic implication. Isaiah, a prophet of Jerusalem close to the royal court, likely knew these songs. Later he called the Messiah "a shoot" (choter) that will come up from the stump of Jesse, even a "branch" (netser) that will bear fruit (Is 11:1). Jeremiah referred to the "righteous Branch" or "Branch of righteousness" from David (Jr 23:5; 33:15) and Zechariah (Zch 3:8; 6:12) used the term "Branch" with a messianic meaning.¹

- 8. How does the description of God's protection in vv 5-6 compare to the great Exodus? Ex 13:21-22
- 9. What is the result of making it through the Lord's judgment?
- 10. What does this say about the purpose of God's judgment?

APPLICATION

Would God see you more bent towards obedience or curses? What filth can He wash away? Vs 4

God is long-suffering as He watches people viciously exploit one another and selfishly ravage His creation. But there is coming a day when unbelieving sinners will be punished and God's people will share in the glories of His kingdom. Are you ready?²
