INTRODUCTION

What is something that we treat as fact even when there is very little evidence for it?

OBSERVATION/INTERPRETATION

The Empty Tomb... <u>Read John 20:1-10</u>

- 1. Who are the first people to show-up on the scene of the burial place of Jesus? How and why do they come?
- 2. What do they find? What physical evidence does one see in these verses that point towards the resurrection?
- 3. What is it that blinds the disciples to the fact that Jesus may be risen from the dead?
- 4. How do Mary, Peter and the "other disciple" react to what they saw? What conclusions are drawn?

Jesus Appears... <u>Read John 20:11-29</u>

- ...to Mary Magdalene v.11-18
- ...to His Disciples v. 19-21
- ...to Thomas v. 24-29

Look at each of the above three characters and ask the following questions:

- 5. What is the initial response? What transpires? What causes change in their heart/thought? What are the results?
- 6. Reading verses 30-31, how does John summarize his purpose for writing?
- 7. What do we learn from Jesus about calling people to believe?
- 8. What difference does the evidence of Jesus' resurrection make in your life?

APPLICATION

• Who is someone you know that needs to know about the reality of Jesus's resurrection? What can you do to help them hear/understand about this reality?
