INTRODUCTION

Do you think it's going to get easier or more difficult for Christians in the Pentagon? Explain **OBSERVATION/INTERPRETATION**

Read 2 Tim 3:1-9

Note: "Weak-willed" refers to women that were unstable, guilt ridden because of the sins, torn by lust, victims of various false teachers.

- 1. How does Paul describe people in the last days? Vv 2-5
- 2. How does this compare to today?
- 3. What do these people lack?
- 4. What are the last days? Matthew 24:36-44; Mark 13:5-7
- 5. What are some examples of God's power that people are denying? v. 5
- 6. What does it mean to have a "form of godliness?" Why are they dangerous? Why would they be in church?
- 7. What does Paul say to do in relation to people who flaunt their ungodly behavior? v 5
- 8. We are told to love the sinner and hate the sin. How can we influence ungodly people without having them shape us? 2 Corinthians 10:5
- 9. How does our society encourage people to let themselves be controlled by evil desires?
- 10. How might someone learn but not acknowledge the truth (about salvation)? v. 7 *Note: Salvation seems more about submission than about knowledge.*
- 11. Life crises are often doors to change for good or evil. How might these verses keep someone from being spiritually manipulated? 2 Corinthians 3:5

APPLICATION

- How might you be denying God's power?
- Sin has consequences. What do you want to change today that you don't want revealed later?
