Lesson #9 - Galatians – SONS OF GOD

INTRODUCTION

What would be the value of growing up in a multi-ethnic community? **OBSERVATION/INTERPRETATION**

Read Gal 3:26 – 4:7

Note: We are called "sons" rather than children because in the context of the day, it was still a patriarchal society and definite advantages prevailed for male children. Sons were granted a unique position of honor not available to daughters. God is the Father of all men <u>creatively</u> (Acts 17:24-28) he is not the Father of all men <u>redemptively</u> (Jn 14:6).

- Note: An heir is someone who inherits something or is entitled to something in the future.
- 6. If you were a Jew, how would you feel about the Galatians' new relationship?
- 7. How are those that live under the law immature? Vv 1-2
- 8. Before the Galatians became Christians, how were they like slaves? V 3
- 9. How did the coming of Christ perfectly satisfy the requirements of the Law? Mt 5:17-18
- 10. What are some benefits of becoming a believer and part of God's family? Some drawbacks?
- 11. Whom did God send to confirm each believer's inheritance? V. 6 How does God do this today? John 14:6
- 12. How are believers moved to address God? How is that different from historical Judaism? V 6
- 13. How can we give God the honor, reverence and respect that He deserves and at the same time call Him "Abba" (Daddy)?
- 14. Since Galatians are no longer slaves, what had they become? What are the expectations of someone in this category?

15. In what ways do Christians discriminate or value some types of Christians over others?

- What steps can you take to go beyond your cultural boundaries to befriend Christians who are different from you?
