## Respect?

On a cross Country flight a pastor was seated next to an atheist. Every few minutes one of his children or grandchildren would come to his seat to see if he needed anything - food, drink, something to read. They'd just come and check on him. The atheist commented, "The respect your children and grandchildren show you is wonderful. Mine don't show me that respect."

"As I think about it," the pastor said. "to my children and grandchildren I am one step closer to the God who created the Hebrews, the God who spoke to us at Sinai. To yours, you are merely one step closer to the apes."

That story, in a not-so-subtle way, communicates an important message. Being the people of God has a profound impact on how we treat other people, especially the ones closest to us. It stands in stark contrast to the bumper sticker that says, "Be nice to your children; they'll pick your nursing home." Or the one that reads, "Honor thy father and mother; they haven't made their will yet."
